PILF Testifies to Pennsylvania House of Representatives on Election Integrity *Presents Report Showing Problems with Philadelphia Voter Roll Maintenance.*

(Indianapolis, IN) – October 4. J. Christian Adams, President and General Counsel of the Public Interest Legal Foundation, [testified](#) today before the Pennsylvania House of Representatives State Government Committee. He presented [a report](#) published by PILF on aliens and felons on the voter rolls in the city of Philadelphia. The information was gathered from documents gained through public records requests made through the National Voter Registration Act.

The report reveals that dozens of aliens who have been removed from the rolls over that past three years have actually been voting.

The report also shows how Philadelphia election officials leave thousands of incarcerated felons on the rolls, even though they are ineligible to vote.

This means that poll books listing eligible voters will contain the names of ineligible registrants in the November election. By law, lists of eligible voters are to be kept accurate and current—they must only contain eligible voters.

“Clean rolls are the most important ingredient for clean elections.” said J. Christian Adams, President and General Counsel of the Public Interest Legal Foundation. “This report shows that voter fraud exists in Philadelphia and federal and state law enforcement officials should enforce the law. Otherwise voter fraud will be encouraged.”
