DECLARATION OF SUE BECKER

1. I am an attorney employed by the Public Interest Legal Foundation.
2. On January 31, 2020, I traveled to Springfield Illinois to the office of the State Board of Elections to inspect a variety of list maintenance data, data attached to the statewide registration list and the statewide registration list that was to be available on an office computer.
3. Upon arrival, I produced identification, signed in, and was led to a desk and computer.
4. A few minutes later, an employee entered a passcode on the desktop which opened up a database.
5. I was told that I could not take photos of the screen, nor print anything, and that I could not receive a copy of any list maintenance data or the registration list unless I was a political action committee.
6. The employee told me that I could search the database using a search screen.
7. When I asked to view the entirety of list maintenance data attached to the statewide voter registration list, I was told that there was not a list available for me to view.
8. The employee explained that the public access database allowed me to search for either a specific name or a birthdate.
9. The employee confirmed that I could not enter a search term for a range of documents, nor could I search and view any category of documents, such as all registrants with a birth year of 1900.
10. At no time was the requested list maintenance data or statewide voter registration list made available to me either electronically or on paper.
